




Whey do migrants move?

What is going to happen to migration in the short term?

Numbers: Likely to decrease

- Fall in value of pound
- Eurozone economy will improve
- Psychological effect of not being welcomed
- Bulgarian/Romanian 'bulge' past

Position of EU nationals in the UK

- Likely to be able to stay especially if long term residents
- Many practical problems: cut off? recording? Costly bureaucratic system

Future arrangements I

EEA

- Free movement of persons, including CRD, but not 'Citizenship'
- Same derogations as for EU but also general derogation: 'If serious economic, societal or environmental difficulties of a sectorial or regional nature liable to persist are arising, a Contracting Party may unilaterally take appropriate measures under the conditions and procedures laid down in Article 113.'

Future arrangements II

WTO

- No general free movement of persons
- Some limited services: mode 4 (5% of GATS service provision)

CETA

- No general free movement of persons
- Limited services

Future arrangements III

Bespoke deal

- limiting migration to workers who already have a job + emergency brake
 - How to monitor?
 - Benefits?
 - Risks
- Self-employed?
- Sector specific schemes: agriculture v coffee shops?
- Regional specific scheme
