Stein Evju var med i arbeidet bak stiftelsen av NBBF i 1968, og har i ettertid hatt et stort antall verv både der og i klubbssammenheng. Men det er som internasjonal dommer fra 1968, formann i DK, instruktør på forbundsdommerkurs fram til 1984, samt sin innsats på banen i over 400 toppseriekamper, at Evju har markert seg som den mest sentrale personligheten innenfor dommermiljøet siden den spede starten. Han ble invitert til å dømme den svenske SM-finalen i 1969, var med på FIBAs dommerkurs som eksaminator fra 1975, og var i praksis den som hadde ansvaret for spilleregler og tolkninger i Norge i en årrekke. Sesongen 86/87 var hans siste på nasjonalt nivå, totalt ble det nesten 1000 kamper på Evju før han ga seg. I dag er han professor på Institutt for Privatrett, Universitetet i Oslo, men har ikke vært aktiv på noen basketfronter på mange år.



Når dømte du sist basketball på nasjonalt nivå? Hvilken tidsperiode var du aktiv på nasjonalt nivå?

Svar: De første førstedivisjons- og NM-kampene dømte jeg 1967 og 1968. Siste sesong jeg dømte hovedserie/nasjonalt nivå var sesongen 1986-87. Sesongen 1987-88 dømte jeg et par internasjonale kamper, men var ellers bare aktiv i lavere divisjoner og offisielle turneringer til og med sesongen 1991-92, som var min siste. Gjennom førstedivisjon/hovedserie først og fremst, dømte jeg de steder som var å dømme på den tid, fra Oslo til Bergen og fra Kristiansand til Trondheim og Tromsø.

Why do migrants move?

Work/better work

Increase pay

What is going to happen to migration in the short term?

Numbers: Likely to decrease

- Fall in value of pound
- Eurozone economy will improve
- Psychological effect of not being welcomed
- Bulgarian/Romanian 'bulge' past

Position of EU nationals in the UK

- Likely to be able to stay especially if long term residents
- Many practical problems: cut off? recording? Costly bureaucratic system

Future arrangements I

EEA

- Free movement of persons, including CRD, but not 'Citizenship'
- Same derogations as for EU but also general derogation: 'If serious economic, societal or environmental difficulties of a sectorial or regional nature liable to persist are arising, a Contracting Party may unilaterally take appropriate measures under the conditions and procedures laid down in Article 113.'

Future arrangements II

WTO

- No general free movement of persons
- Some limited services: mode 4 (5% of GATS service provision)

CETA

- No general free movement of persons
- Limited services

Future arrangements III

Bespoke deal

- limiting migration to workers who already have a job + emergency brake
 - How to monitor?
 - Benefits?
 - Risks
- Self-employed?
- Sector specific schemes: agriculture v coffee shops?
- Regional specific scheme
