Tineke Lambooy was trained as a commercial lawyer specialising in advising on mergers, acquisitions and privatisations in a large international civil law and tax law firm (1989-2007). In this capacity she developed expertise in project management regarding accompanying international transactions and the drafting of contract documentation. She also gained experience in setting up large scale international 'due diligence investigations', i.e. analysing the international business operations of a company (usually an international group of companies) in order to map financial and legal risks and opportunities, mostly in the context of a capital market transaction or M&A transaction.

As of 2003, she started working on a PhD on corporate social responsibility (CSR). Subjects that she covered in her PhD are amongst others: due diligence and human rights (the Ruggie Framework, 2nd pillar, and the implementation in existing corporate due diligence modes); corporate governance and CSR; CSR and reporting; setting up anti-corruption programmes in large organisations; case study Shell in Nigeria: from human rights conflicts to corporate social responsibility; case study best practices in sustainable corporate water use; case study best practices in investing in biodiversity, forests and nature investment funds; case study stakeholder management in the international textile supply chain. She obtained her PhD in 2010. She was invited by the Dutch Parliament as an expert in a hearing about the application by Shell of the Ruggie Framework in their operations in West Africa. She is frequently requested to give presentations on CSR subjects.

From 2007 to present she has been employed by Utrecht University (UU – civil law) and Nyenrode Business University– Center for Sustainability (CfS - multidisciplinary). At UU she is the co-initiator of the international LLM programme: International Business Law and Globalisation, which started in 2007. She developed and lectures in 2 courses: Mergers and Acquisitions; Legal Aspects of Globalisation – CSR. And she lectures in Dutch Corporate Law. She is also pursuing academic research in the field of CSR. At Nyenrode she is senior researcher. Her work includes supervising multidisciplinary research projects on enhancing sustainability standards by private actors. Two research themes have her special interest: capital market and biodiversity, and human rights and business.

Other activities include: Special Editor of annual issue on CSR and SRI of European Company Law (first issue 2011-2/3, Member of the Round Table of Worldconnectors; Board member of the NGO Stand Up For Your Rights (focussed on human rights) and board member of the Club of Rome (Dutch Chapter); VNO-NCW Klankbord Group (since July 2011).
