List of Speakers

MADS ANDENAS holds the Chair in the Faculty of Law at the University of Oslo since 2008. He is the UN Special Rapporteur on Arbitrary Detention, and the Chair of the UN Working Group on Arbitrary Detention. He is also a member of the Executive Council of the International Law Association.

HANS BORN is the deputy head of the Research Division of the Geneva Centre for the Democratic Control of Armed Forces (DCAF). He currently focuses on intelligence oversight as well as the role of parliaments and ombuds-institutions in security sector governance. He has published widely on intelligence accountability.

IAIN CAMERON is professor in public international law at Uppsala University in Sweden. He has specialized particularly in issues relating to security and human rights. In 2005 he was appointed by the Swedish government to the Council of Europe advisory body on constitutional and international law issues, the Venice Commission.

BERTOLD HUBER is the Deputy President of the G 10 Commission in German Bundestag.

THEO KORITZINSKY is an associate professor of Social Studies in Oslo University College. He is also a former Member of Parliament and Chairman of the Socialist Left Party of Norway. He was elected to the Committee on 1 July 2007 and his term ends in 30 June 2019.

DANIEL SCHWERI worked for the Data Protection Commissioner of the canton of Lucerne and was appointed Deputy Data Protection Commissioner of the canton of Bern, followed by two years of ICT audit work for the Court of Auditors of the canton of Bern. Since 2013, he is working as an Inspector for the Executive Intelligence Oversight in the Swiss Federal Department of Defense, Civil protection and Sports (DDPS).

IAN LEIGH is professor of law, member of the Durham Global Security Institute and the director of Postgraduate Studies/Director of PGR, Durham Law School, United Kingdom. His research interests span legal aspects of national security, local government law, human rights and religious liberty.

ELDBJØRG LØWER is the Committee Chair of the EOS Committee (Norwegian Parliamentary Oversight Committee on Intelligence and Security Services). She was elected to the Committee on 1 July 2011 and her term ends on 30 June 2019. She is a former deputy leader of the Liberal Party, Minister of Labour and Administration as well as Minister of Defence.

LIESBETH HORSTINK is a Member of Dutch Review Commission for Intelligence and Security Services (CTIVD). In addition, she is a member of the Council of State (administrative jurisdiction division). Previously, she was a public prosecutor at District Court of the Hague and the Deputy National Ombudsman.

FREDRIK SEJERSTED is the Attorney General of Norway since 2015. Previously, he was a professor of law and the director of the Centre for European Law, Faculty of Law, University of Oslo. He also served until recently the Council of Europe advisory body on constitutional and international law issues, the Venice Commission.
